MEETING IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS: On Wednesday 6th July 2011 a meeting was held in room 21 HoC, organised by the APPG for Cyprus and ORMC(UK) to discuss solely the issue of our Missing. Representatives from our sister organisations of Cyprus and Greece attended, as well as officials from the Federation. APPG chairman David Burrowes introduced all the speakers and reiterated the importance of the two communities continue to help the CMP in its efforts. ORMC President stressed the need for the UK Government to pressure Turkey to allow access to so called military zones and give all the information it has on our Missing.

On the same note was also the speech by the Cypriot delegation. Unfortunately Lord Maginnis tried to politicise the issue and wasted time talking. He was put right by MP Ian Lavery. Present were also T. Cypriots who put their case of their Missing. Time run out very soon and the chairman said that another meeting will be organised soon to continue the discussion

DISCUSSION IN THE HOUSE. With the initiative of MP Mike Freer a discussion took place in the presence of Minister Jeremy Brown. The MP pointed out that Turkey is not at all co-operating on the issue of the missing and he referred to the ECHR decision and Turkey's responsibilities adding that it is estimated that 500 to 800 persons have been taken to Turkish prisons and the fate of many of them is still unknown. He also mentioned the case of the 5 year old then Christakis Georgiou. He concluded that pressure must be put on Turkey to comply.

PICKETING AND MARCH. On

Tuesday 12 July 2011 ORMC(UK) members and friends were outside the House of Commons with our banner, carrying photos of our Missing and distributing leaflets. MP's came out and met us and then we went in the House where the discussion and lobbying took place.
